
This work is a variation study for plate 7 of the La Ville (later Ma Ville) portfolio (see Saphire, p. 238), originally conceived for the publication planned by Tériade, Paris, in 1959. As the editorial project evolved, this study ultimately served as the basis for a lithograph published in the portfolio Mes Voyages in 1960.

Historical Context

In 1954, the publisher and patron Tériade initiated an ambitious project with Fernand Léger and Blaise Cendrars: to celebrate Paris, a shared source of inspiration, through a deluxe book combining text and lithographs. A substantial advance was provided, and the two collaborators explored Montparnasse, the Moulin Rouge and their favourite Parisian neighbourhoods to develop the project.

After Léger's sudden death in 1955 in Gif-sur-Yvette, as the book was nearing completion, a change of course by Cendrars led to the abandonment of the original literary concept. The study presented here was eventually reworked and published as a lithograph in Mes Voyages in 1960: a very limited edition now of considerable rarity.
